Thanks to Bobby Prieto for leading the discussion on Mechanics. Some take-aways include: Remember that Safety comes first, wear eye protection, must have safe tires with proper inflation, check oil only after car has been sitting all night, you can check your tire tread using a penny, 3 things make your engine run (compression, ignition, and fuel), the #1 thing to keep your car running is oil – check it regularly, the 2 ways to cool your engine is with oil and water, don't open radiator cap until engine is cold, 2 ways to deliver fuel is via carburetor and injection, use ethanol treatment in your car (and mower & chain saw), and check your brakes every 10-15K miles.

And, BIG THANKS to Big George for his Medical Moment which focused being aware when messing around with mechanics: be careful of battery acid, ice is the best for strains, if you crush any hands or fingers its best to go to the hospital, and remember to dispose of all chemicals properly.
