Thanks to JOE and LINA PIPPIN of T.369, for their CULTURAL DIVERSITY Presentation: from Joe we learned the following: Diversity was God's Plan. Related MBs include American Cultures, Indian Lore, Genealogy, Citizenship in the World, Citizenship in the Nation, and Disabilities Awareness. Joe recommended attending the next locally held Festival of Nations event. Joe discussed in detail the requirements of American Cultures MB.

Lina explained various facts about the Muslim culture including: the Islam greeting of Peace Be Upon You. There are 1.2 Billion Muslims in the world, and 8 Million Muslims in America but only 20% are Arab. The 5 pillars of Islam: Shahada, Prayers (5 daily), Charity, Fasting, and Hajj.

And THANKS to **Big George Goehring** for his **Medical Moment** on conducting a **Neurological Exam** – Let's say your Scout has been hiking hard and is dehydrated and not looking good or acting strange, this is when you would conduct this type of exam. Take-Aways include: divide the body down the middle, there are 12 cranial nerves and you can do a quick test to check them out as in pupil response, hearing response, can the victim open his mouth, can he grin, you can give them tests like the ones you see cops giving a person suspected of being under the influence, and ask them a question to see if they cognizant of what is going on.
